The Human Capital and Employment unit of JRC (JRC.B4) wishes to recruit a quantitative researcher in the field of labour economics/sociology, to work in the Scientific project named "Societal Implications of Mobility Disruption Scenarios" (SIMOD). The project aims at strengthening the JRC capacities to support the social dimension of impact assessments dealing with mobility disruption scenarios. SIMOD will analyse the job impact and employment intensity of all segments of the transport sector (manufacturing, maintenance services, as well as transport services) as well as, to the extent possible, the socio-economic stratification and skills of workforce.

The successful candidate will be expected to support the Employment and Skills team in the quantitative analysis of employment and skills, the digital transformation implications on the nature of work and to contribute to its research work and scientific activities in general. She/he should have a solid background in at least one of the following fields: labour market research, occupational analysis, skills and/or quality of work. Expertise in micro-econometric analysis, including a good command of software such as Stata or equivalent are pre-requisite. The successful candidate will also be expected to have experience in applied econometric analysis and be able to process and manage large socio-economic databases. A track record of research and publications in the areas of labour market research, occupational analysis, skills and/or quality of work would be an asset. Research and analytical tasks will involve collaboration with other European Commission services and other relevant international organizations and research institutions

Candidates should have a PhD (doctoral diploma) or a minimum of 5 years professional experience after university studies of at least 3 years attested by a diploma. A good level of written and spoken English is essential.
