As a member of the Research, Innovation and Competitiveness Group of the Unit, the successful candidate will:

- Monitor research and innovation activities in low-carbon energy technologies carried out at national and European levels; assess their progress in the context of the 2030 energy policy goals and the transition to a climate-neutral economy; and publish on the EU progress in energy Research and Innovation in high profile Commission reports.
- Contribute to key research and innovation policy actions of the Commission in close collaboration with other Commission services, and when required, experts beyond the Commission, such as the regular monitoring and reporting of progress of implementation of the European Strategic Energy Technology Plan (see [setis.ec.europa.eu](https://setis.ec.europa.eu)) and the assessment of national energy and climate reports according to the Governance for the Energy Union Regulation.
- Contribute to the knowledge management and policy support tasks of the Unit by using the data available in-house, as well as external sources and publications, to produce evidence-based assessments, inputs to policy documents and briefs and updating the SETIS website.
