WE ARE:

As the science and knowledge service of the Commission, the mission of DG Joint Research Centre is to support EU policies with independent evidence throughout the whole policy cycle.

The current vacancy is in the Euratom Coordination Unit of the Directorate for Strategy, Work Programme and Resources of the JRC. The Unit is dealing with the coordination of all aspects of the JRC Euratom Programmes. Activities managed by the unit include:

- coordination of the Euratom research and training programme of the JRC;
- coordination of JRC's activities in decommissioning as well as the radiation safety of JRC sites;
- coordination of JRC's activities in nuclear safeguards and CBRN security;
- coordination of the collaborations of the R&D Euratom agreements with EU Member States, international organisations such as the IAEA and other international partners, including Generation IV International Forum;
- coordination of JRC's activities in nuclear sciences applications (non-power uses of radioactivity).

WE PROPOSE:

A position as Scientific / Technical Project manager to support its activities in the fields of nuclear safety, nuclear waste management and decommissioning. Main tasks will include:

- support to the coordination and follow-up of the JRC activities and collaborations related to nuclear safety, decommissioning and waste management, radiation protection and emergency preparedness and related areas, within the JRC and with other stakeholders. This includes participation in JRC corporate activities related to the nuclear safety, decommissioning and waste management, radiation protection and emergency preparedness;
- draft, review and follow-up administrative and technical documents and reports related to the Euratom activities of the JRC and contribution to Commission Inter Services Groups on related issues;
- support the internal communication and knowledge sharing within the DG and with other Commission services and international partners on nuclear safety, decommissioning and waste management, radiation protection and emergency preparedness.

WE LOOK FOR:

An expert with the following qualifications:

- University degree or equivalent education in nuclear physics, nuclear engineering, nuclear sciences or related fields;
- A minimum of five years recent experience in the management of international projects and/or work in multidisciplinary teams in nuclear related areas;
- A good knowledge of the Euratom programme, as well as of the EU nuclear policies;
- A strong problem-solving attitude, proven communication and drafting competences, good interpersonal skills, the ability to work in a team, the capacity to take initiative, and to work responsibly and autonomously.
- A very good knowledge of written and spoken English and French (minimum B2 level on both).

INDICATIVE CONTRACT'S DURATION:

36 months initial contract with possible renewals up to maximum 6 years.

RULES AND ELIGIBILITY:

To be eligible for the position, the candidate must be on a valid EPSO reserve list for Function Group IV contract staff.
