WE ARE:

As the science and knowledge service of the Commission, the mission of DG Joint Research Centre is to support EU policies with independent evidence throughout the whole policy cycle.

The current vacancy is in Directorate D “Sustainable Resources” / Unit JRC.D.4 “Economics of Agriculture” which focuses on the economic analysis of agricultural, environmental, food and trade policies in the EU, the further development of the European bioeconomy, as well as food security and related policies in third countries. The policy support provided by the Unit is based on quantitative economic research, in particular using agro-economic modelling tools.

WE PROPOSE:

The unit proposes a position of a researcher to contribute to the economic analysis of EU agricultural markets and policies using large-scale partial equilibrium models.

The main tasks will be to:

- participate in the elaboration of the EU medium term prospects for agricultural commodity markets;
- analyse global and EU agricultural markets/policies by means of quantitative tools (i.e. baseline and scenario analysis);
- contribute to the analysis of uncertainties (e.g. weather events) and structural breaks present in agricultural markets;
- initiate, manage and monitor research projects, including the preparation of project tenders;
- contribute to drafting scientific publications and policy reports;
- further develop and improve large scale agricultural economic models, including writing programming code;
- conduct economic analysis, including preparation and presentation of reports, summaries of results for policy briefings and academic papers;
- contribute to the cooperation with policy services and development of the international network of cooperation of the JRC.

WE LOOK FOR:

The ideal candidate should have:

- a doctoral degree or a Ph.D. in agronomy, economics, mathematics, statistics or related fields, or a minimum of 5 years of proved research experience in agricultural economics or similar subjects after university studies of at least 3 years attested by a diploma;
- a solid experience in quantitative methods/tools for economic impact assessments;
- a good knowledge of statistical packages (e.g. R, STATA) and other programming languages used by agricultural economic models (e.g. GAMS, GEMPACK);
- be familiar with large scale partial equilibrium models for agriculture, ideally of the Aglink-Cosimo model (<http://www.agri-outlook.org/about/>);
- good understanding of the trade-offs between the economic, environmental and social dimensions of

agriculture and food systems, knowledge of the EU's Common Agricultural Policy (desirable);

- a very good level of written and spoken English (C1) and knowledge of at least one other EU language (compulsory).

INDICATIVE CONTRACT'S DURATION:

36 months initial contract with possible renewals up to maximum 6 years.
