The current vacancy is in Directorate for Sustainable Resources/ Water and Marine Resources Unit. The mission of Directorate for Sustainable Resources is to provide independent scientific evidence to support the development, implementation, evaluation and coherence of EU policies, mainly in the areas of agriculture and rural development, development cooperation, environment and climate change, blue growth and fisheries, the bioeconomy, industry and trade.

The Water and Marine Resources Unit at the Sustainable Resources Directorate provides scientific and technical support to Commission services. In particular, its mission is to carry out scientific assessments addressing societal and economic challenges deriving from the evolving vulnerability of the European and global water environment. It contributes innovative solutions to sustainably manage water resources in the face of increasing trends of global population, urbanisation, pollution, over-exploitation, land use and climate change and ensures that they are adequately linked to policy development and implementation.

WE PROPOSE:

We offer a position as scientific officer in the Fisheries and Aquaculture Sector of the Water and Marine Resources Unit.

The position is linked to the economic analysis of marine living resources, i.e., the fishing and aquaculture sectors under the remit of scientific advice provision to the Common Fisheries Policy (CFP).

The jobholder will develop and maintain models underpinning the assessment of economic costs and benefits of fisheries management measures – both to the fishing industry and to the authorities that manage them. This also includes bio-economic assessments.

The assignment includes the enhancement and maintenance of the JRC data management, dissemination and web facilities supporting the Data Collection Framework Regulation (DCF) and the Scientific, Technical and Economic Committee for Fisheries (STECF). Moreover, the post entails the coordination of fisheries and aquaculture economic analysis carried out by the JRC.

The jobholder will organise and participate in the STECF Expert working group meetings related to socio-economics of fisheries.

WE LOOK FOR:

We are looking for a highly motivated and skilled data analyst/scientist with working experience in socio-economic analysis related to the management and governance of fisheries and aquaculture.

The ideal candidate should have a PhD in economics, or, alternatively, at least 5 years of full time relevant research experience after the first University degree giving direct access to doctoral (PhD) studies.

The candidate must have a strong background in economics with at least three years of relevant experience, preferably in economic analysis or economic modelling experience in fisheries.

Essential requirements are a strong record of socio-economic analysis. Proven experience in econometrics and bio-economic analytical approaches is an asset.

Preferential requirements include experience in stakeholder engagement and policy advice particularly in relation to the Common Fisheries Policy.

Competence in writing reports and communication is an advantage. A good knowledge of English (B2) is essential.

36 months initial contract with possible renewals up to maximum 6 years.
