## **WE PROPOSE**

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The jobholder will contribute in the coordination of the following areas:

- The Euratom research and training programme of JRC;
- JRC's activities in nuclear safety, radioactive waste management, decommissioning, and emergency preparedness, including the radiation safety of JRC sites;
- JRC's activities in nuclear safeguards and CBRN security;
- JRC's activities in nuclear science applications and radiation protection;
- the collaborations and R&D Euratom agreements with EU Member States, third countries, and International Organisations;
- JRC's nuclear knowledge management, communication and foresight.

Functions and duties include:

- Support the implementation and follow up of knowledge management and foresight activities in the nuclear domain.
- Draft, review and present technical contributions to EU Institutions (Council, EEAS), partner DGs (ENER, RTD), EU Member States or third countries in meetings, documents and reports related to the Euratom activities of the JRC in the field of knowledge management and foresight within the nuclear domain;
- To support the coordination of the JRC stakeholders and collaboration agreements with EU Member States and international partners on nuclear related areas of work.
- To assist in the coordination of JRC support to EU nuclear-related policies in topics related to knowledge management.

## **WE LOOK FOR**

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- A minimum of three years of accomplished university degree with a minimum of 1 year experience in the management of international projects and/or work in multidisciplinary teams, preferably in nuclear related areas.
  - The candidate must be able to work in an international and multi-disciplinary team, with good communication skills towards, experts and non-experts and other stakeholders.
  - A good knowledge of the Euratom Research and Training Programme, as well as of the EU policies and functioning of the EU Institutions.
  - Strong problem-solving attitude, proven organisational, communication and drafting competences, good inter-personal skills, the ability to work in a team, the capacity to take initiative, and to work responsibly and autonomously.
  - A very good knowledge of spoken and written English is essential.
  - Good understanding of relevant administrative requirements preferably acquired in an international organization would be an asset.
