#### **WE ARE**

The [Joint Research Centre \(JRC\)](#) provides independent, evidence-based knowledge and science, supporting EU policies to positively impact society.

The current vacancies are in Unit JRC.F1 Disease Prevention. Within its Directorate for Health and Food, the Disease Prevention Unit supports EU policies in public health for promoting excellence and equality of health-care in all Member States.

The Unit is composed of a young and dynamic team of experts working on: health information on cancer and rare diseases; healthcare quality, and health promotion and prevention of non-communicable diseases.

The European Commission's Directorate General for Health and Food Safety (DG Sante), together with the Joint Research Centre (JRC), have established the European Commission Initiatives on Breast, Colorectal\* and Cervical Cancer and are in the process to put in place the European Commission initiatives on gastric, lung and prostate cancer, subject to this vacancy note. The activities are carried out in response to the amended Council Recommendation, adopted in December 2022\*\*/\*\*\*.

All initiatives consist of two main pillars each: i) evidence-based guidelines for cancer primary prevention, screening and diagnosis, reflecting the latest scientific developments, and ii) an associated quality assurance scheme for implementation in healthcare settings covering the entire care pathway.

## **WE PROPOSE**

The Unit is looking for two scientific/technical project officers assisting the activities in the area of cancer, in particular to collaborate on the development of guidelines for cancer screening, diagnosis and associated activities.

The jobholders will support the healthcare quality activities and in particular, steer and/or collaborate on the development of evidence-based guideline and associated indicators, defined either internally or externally by collaborating entities, for primary prevention screening and diagnosis regarding gastric, lung and/or prostate cancer.

They will also:

- Support and/or manage working group meetings and associated activities with international participation including the provision of background documentation.
- Ensure the application of a consistent methodological approach and information flow of the project products from conception until publication on the dedicated website.
- Support the collaborations with stakeholders, such as other Commission services as well as external entities, also representing the team.
- Support internal and external audiences (defining reports and/or supporting briefings, scientific publications, presentations to conferences, etc.);
- Attend dedicated training in the underpinning methodology for guideline development.
- Provide scientific/technical support to the healthcare quality activities more generally.
- Support the contract management in the given topic areas.

## **WE LOOK FOR**

We are looking for two candidates with:

- University degree in biomedical disciplines, such as Medicine, Public Health, Epidemiology, or Life Sciences
- Three years of experience in at least one of the fields is required: i) in activities related to cancer primary prevention, screening and/or care and/or ii) health research methodologies.

Experience in health guideline developments will constitute an advantage, as well as the knowledge in consensus reaching methodologies, as applied by the existing breast and colorectal cancer initiative (<https://healthcare-quality.jrc.ec.europa.eu>).

The new colleagues must be proactive and able to work independently across different projects and teams. He or she will have a good ability to work on more than one project simultaneously, as well as good communication and reporting skills.

A strong motivation, enthusiasm and an excellent team-player are equally essential. Familiarity with working in an international environment is an asset. English level B2 or higher is required.
