From an administrative point of view it is linked to the unit for Interinstitutional, International Relations &amp; Outreach (JRC A.3).</p> <p>The mission of that unit is, inter alia, to manage DG JRC's relations with its strategic stakeholders and to co-ordinate the JRC communication strategy.</p> <p>The position relates to the collaborative institutional History Project (iHiP) that ultimately will deliver a scientifically correct presentation of the 60+ years of the JRC.</p> <p>The trainee will be part of a team that transforms un-sorted paper documents into a modern digital archive and who will work with this archive.</p> <p>This project mainly relates to the development, optimisation and implementation of a software pipeline for a (semi-) automatic archiving of digital documents, including deciding to retain or not the paper original. The software is expected to make use of deep learning and natural language processing.</p> <p>The trainee will also be involved in developing, train, and using similar software for analysing documents for their historic relevance; and in</p>
