Further information is available at: http://www.jrc.ec.europa.eu</p> <p><u>Short description of activity:</u></p> <p>The current vacancy is with the Demography, Migration and Governance Unit, of the Space, Security and Migration Directorate. This Unit carries out research in support of EU policies in migration and related fields and is responsible for the day-to-day operation of the Knowledge Centre on Migration and Demography.</p> <p>The European Commission's Knowledge Centre on Migration and Demography (KCMD) established in June 2016 is steered by JRC, DG HOME, and seven other services. It is tasked with providing solid scientific evidence for EU policy makers in migration, supporting the European Agenda on Migration and focusing on migration and demography developments at global scale addressing both short and mid-to-longer term policy needs.</p> <p>The KCMD is there to map and structure existing knowledge on migration, address some of the key knowledge gaps through its own research, extend the knowledge through networking with external partners, and disseminate its findings and care for their uptake by EU policy makers. Its activity areas span from legal migration and integration, to the external dimension of migration, to underpinning work in innovative data sources and data analytics.</p> <p>We are looking for a Trainee to contribute to a research project on Children in Migration. This work consists of data collection and analysis as well investigation on selected topics of interest, with special focus on unaccompanied migrant children.</p> <p>In detail, he/she will collect, manage, and analyse data and information on migrant children reception</p>

A preliminary (but not exhaustive) list of topics include: transfers and relocation, missing children, children in detention, age estimation, access to health and educational support, countries of transit. The work will be based on open source information (reports, studies, data bases) or from particular sources from individual European Member States.
