Each trainee will work together with a dedicated first author of a specific narrative.</p> <p>The position includes the identification of relevant sources and, if needed, their digitisation and integration into the historic repository of the JRC as well as their correct referencing in the text.</p> <p>The position also includes the provision of administrative support to the iHiP.</p> |
